

MYRA Admission Policy and Criteria

MYRA looks for candidates who are well rounded with interest and abilities **in a wide range of areas and activities** and have fire in the belly and ready to go the extra mile. While academic performance is very important, it is not the only criterion used for admission/scholarship. Anchored by this broad framework, MYRA's selection criteria centers around four different aspects:

1. Consistently good academic record: MYRA takes into account candidates' 10th, 12th and Graduation Scores
2. Entrance Exam score: MYRA considers the following four different entrance exam scores – GMAT; GRE; CAT; and XAT
3. Statement of Purpose (SOP) Essay: MYRA looks for understanding the person behind the application and hence SOP plays an important role. SOP offers candidates an opportunity to share their thinking and showcase their achievements in areas other than academics. It is also a way to weave one's dreams and passion into a convincing narrative about one's choice of activities whether music or fine arts or sports or others
4. Extra-Curricular Activities and Achievements: If one has achieved special success as exemplified in awards or medals etc., including patents and such other intellectual property, due consideration is given

Points are awarded for all the above criteria. Following is the template for awarding points:

- Interview Performance is also graded as:
 - a. Excellent (10 Points)
 - b. Very Good (8 Points)
 - c. Good (6 points)
 - d. Fair (4 points)

Who gets selected?

- **Those who get total points of 18 and above are selected.**

- **Partial Scholarships:**

#	Points	Scholarship
1.	Greater 20 but less than 25	▪ 20% tuition fee waiver
2.	Greater 25 but less than 30	▪ 30% tuition fee waiver
3.	Greater 30 but less than 35	▪ 40% tuition fee waiver
4.	Greater than 35	▪ 50% tuition fee waiver
